



Genesis 27

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Read Genesis 27 this week and work through these questions. Some questions are taken from GENESIS: A 12 Week Study by Mitchell Mark

1.	Genesis 27:1 begins, "When Isaac was old and his eyes were dim so that he could not see" In the Bible, dim eyesight can refer not only to physical eyesight but also spiritual discernment (e.g., 1 Sam. 3:1–2), while undimmed eyesight may symbolize physical and spiritual vigor (e.g., Deut. 34:7). In light of these other passages, it seems that Isaac's dim eyes may be not only physical but also spiritual. When "Abraham was old, well advanced in years" (Gen. 24:1) his concern was singularly focused on providing a proper spouse for Isaac. What evidences are there for Isaac's lack of spiritual discernment in Genesis 26:34–27:4?
2.	Read the story of Jacob and Rebekah's deception of Isaac in order for
	Jacob to get his blessing in Genesis 27:5–27:46. While the deception
	succeeds, by the end of the chapter it is clear that everybody loses.
	Isaac's spiritual blurriness leads to painful consequences for his entire
	family. What are the consequences Isaac, Rebekah, Esau and Jacob
	face from this deception?



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
